Loneliness and Isolation Evidence Review 2 Key messages 3 In Don't Stop Me Now (July 2008), the Audit physically isolated (living on one's own, not seeing many other people etc) without feeling lonely For some, physical separation is even a result of choice

- Social isolation is the lack of social contact or support; loneliness is the feeling of being alone or isolated
- Loneliness is a multifaceted issue and may not be simply resolved by tackling one aspect alone
- General practitioners may be well-placed to identify people who are, or who are at risk of, loneliness and social isolation

- Water isolation devices that can turn off a tap if it's been left running This can help to prevent flooding
- Lights that come on automatically when you move around They can help to prevent trips and falls, especially if you get up in the night
- Telephone blockers that can help stop nuisance calls

Methicillin Resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) Best ...

Masks - required for all persons entering the isolation room when MRSA has been found in the patient's respiratory secretions (ie sputum or bronchoscopy specimens), and/or when entering the room of ventilated patients [Level I] 3b Masks - recommended for all persons entering the isolation room/area, of any MRSA positive patient [Level II]

MANAGEMENT OF SCABIES IN LONG- TERM CARE FACILITIES ...

should be evaluated by a healthcare provider Outbreaks usually occur in crowded living conditions and are often a problem in long-term care settings, schools, daycare centers and prisons All outbreaks are immediately reportable in New Jersey If a person has never had scabies before, symptoms may take as long as 4-6 weeks to appear
